


Agreement on Extended-Day Kindergarten

If your school is one that now has extended day kindergarten, you should have a copy of the memorandum of understanding, which outlines the rules as they apply to OEA members.

Last spring OEA learned that several schools would be experimenting with extended-day kindergarten. OEA filed a demand to bargain the impact of that experiment. An agreement was reached and is in effect. If your school is one that now has extended day kindergarten, you should have a copy of the memorandum of understanding, which outlines the rules as they apply to OEA members.

Briefly, the provisions of the memorandum of understanding are as follows:

- *Five-hour day, including lunch, recess.
- *Kindergarten teachers receive the same number of continuous, lunch minutes as other teachers.
- *One-hour, daily, non-student preparation time.
- *The program will be evaluated by March 1, 2002.

This is the only variation of the kindergarten day that is agreed to by OEA. Any other configuration would have to have a waiver.
